1. <u>Five-Year Plan Worksheet</u>	Used to “map out” courses for 8th through 12th grades
2. <u>High School Agreement</u>	Summary of requirements for different Diplomas
3. <u>Diploma Options</u>	Courses to take for different Diploma tracks
4. <u>Community Service Volunteer Form</u>	Use this for documenting formal volunteer hours
5. <u>OTJT (On the Job Training) Form</u>	Use this for documenting On the Job Training (OTJT) experiences for credit
6. <u>Preparing for College</u>	General Guideline Upper math requires to learn to use a graphics calculator
7. <u>Testing for College</u>	Narrative of important tests & testing options
8. <u>Dual Enrollment</u>	Description of Dual Enrollment at college
9. <u>Extra Program/Scholarship Processing</u>	Required for Family Tree to process records
